

These Items are recyclables

Paper and Cartons:

Empty and flatten all boxes and cartons. Tie shredded paper in a plastic bag. Staples, tape and plastic windows in envelopes are okay.

Books (no hardcover)
Cardboard
Catalogs and magazines
Cereal and cracker boxes (remove liners)
Computer paper and office paper
Egg cartons
Gift wrap (no metallic/foil)
Juice boxes and cartons
Junk mail
Milk cartons
Newspaper and inserts
Paper bags
Shoe boxes
Shopping bags (remove handles)
Telephone books

Textiles:

If possible, donate textiles to charity. To recycle, tie fabrics in a clear plastic bag. Buttons and zippers can stay on clothing

Glass

Empty and rinse bottles & jars, Brown, clear and green glass bottles and jars (e.g. beverage bottles, food jars, wine bottles)

Plastics and Polystyrene:

Recycle all plastic labeled on or near the bottom with a - symbol. Empty and rinse containers. Bundle plastic bags inside a plastic bag and knot the top.

Tie foam packing peanuts in a plastic bag.
Beverage bottles (e.g. soda, water)
Bleach & household cleaner bottles
Egg cartons
Flower pots
Foam packing (e.g. hard packing around computers or stereos)
Food containers (e.g. Cottage cheese and margarine tubs, yogurt cups)
Plastic bags (e.g. bread, dry cleaning, grocery newspaper, produce, shopping bags)
Prescription bottles.

Metals

Empty and rinse cans.
Aerosol cans (empty)
Aluminum cans (empty)
Aluminum Furniture (plastic webbing removed)
Aluminum pie pans and foil
Appliances (small metal)
Bimetal containers
Food cans and pet food cans

Metal lids and caps from glass bottles
Paint cans (remove excess, let residue dry)
Pots and pans containers. Bundle plastic bags inside a plastic bag and knot the top.
Tie foam packing peanuts in a plastic bag.
Beverage bottles (e.g. soda, water)
Bleach & household cleaner bottles

Egg cartons

Flower pots

Foam packing (e.g. hard packing around computers or stereos)

Food containers (e.g. cottage cheese and margarine tubs, yogurt cups)
